Australian Apprenticeship Support Loans (AASL)

The Australian Apprenticeship Support Loans (AASL) is available to all apprentices and trainees in occupations on the Priority List. It provides income contingent loans of up to \$25,374 in 2024-25 to help apprentices and trainees meet day to day costs while undertaking their studies.

- The measure also enables backdating of payments to provide immediate support to recipients. Australian Apprentices do not have to repay the loan until they are earning an income above the minimum repayment threshold (\$54,435 for 2024-25).
- Australian Apprentices who complete their apprenticeship will receive a 20% discount on the loan
 amount. In order to maintain the real value of the loan, the loan amount will be indexed according
 to the Consumer Price Index annually.
- On 3 November 2024, the Australian Government announced changes to income contingent student loans, including Australian Apprenticeship Support Loans. Anyone with a student loan, including a AASL debt will have their debt reduced by a further 20% before 1 June 2025, when indexation is applied. The ATO will apply these changes. Getting career ideas

Not sure what jobs might suit you? A career quiz could help you identify pathways options. Quizzes usually asks you questions about your interests, values and preferences. Some quizzes then give you a list of jobs that might interest you, that you can then investigate. There are many tests to choose from including:

- Online career quizzes use your answers to match you to jobs that might suit you.
 - These guizzes are short and aim to open your mind to new career possibilities.
 - Some career quizzes give you a summary of your answers at the end. You can use the results to describe yourself (your strengths, interests and values) to employers in your applications and at interviews.
- Psychometric tests measure how well you will suit a particular role. They test whether your
 personality and strengths match the traits needed in the job. Employers sometimes ask job seekers
 to complete a psychometric test as part of their recruitment process.
- Aptitude quizzes can help you figure out if you have the literacy and numeracy skills required for a
 role.

Values influence the career choices we make, but what exactly are values and how can you identify the values that are important to you - those that will positively impact your career? Sabina Read identifies some common values to help you start thinking about what's important to you. Ask yourself which of the listed values are important to you and whether there are any you want to add.

- Adventure: To actively seek, create, or explore novel or stimulating experiences
- Assertiveness: To respectfully stand up for my rights and request what I want
- Authenticity: To be genuine, real to be true to myself
- Caring: To be considerate towards myself, others, the environment
- Challenge: To keep encouraging myself to grow, learn, improve
- **Cooperation:** To be cooperative and collaborative with others
- Creativity: To be innovative
- Curiosity: To be open-minded and interested; to explore and discover
- Fairness: To be honest with myself and others
- **Humour:** To see and appreciate the funny side of life
- Independence: To be self-supportive, and choose my own way of doing things
- Open-mindedness: To see things through/from other's points of view, and weigh evidence fairly
- Powerful: To strongly influence or wield authority over others, e.g. taking charge, leading, organising
- Respectful: To be thoughtful towards myself or others; to be polite and show positive regard
- **Self-development:** To keep growing, advancing or improving in knowledge, skills, character, or life experience
- Supportiveness: To be helpful, encouraging and available to myself or others

How employers recruit

Research shows that employers value different qualities at different stages of the recruitment process. An employers' focus often shifts from an applicant's experience and qualifications at the application stage to whether the applicant has the right approach and attitude to work and is a good cultural fit to their business at interview. However, qualifications and experience continue to be important at the interview stage if you are applying for a position requiring specific skills. Understanding these differences can help job seekers write a good application or prepare for their job interview. During the application stage employers look for:

- Problem-solving: Finding solutions to challenges.
- Time management: Efficiently managing one's time.

The most important thing to remember is that competition is often strong. It's best not to rest all your hopes on obtaining a scholarship, and it's worth considering back-up options. This includes applying for Government allowances and investigating scholarships that will be available in the next application period. Many scholarships are available to students in their second and subsequent years of study, so keep an eye out for such alternatives. Adjustment Factors can increase your chances of entry into university courses. If you are eligible for Adjustment Factors through one of the Assistance schemes, your position on the merit scale for entry into a course will be 'adjusted' to give you a new, more competitive score.

Universities award Adjustment Factors for a variety of reasons and programs, so you will have to enquire to every university you are interested in attending, to fully understand their eligibility requirements. International students wanting to study at a university

If you are needing to gain the prerequisite of English and/or may not achieve a pass in a Senior English subject at the end of 2025, you could sit and gain an appropriate grade in one of the following tests:

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IELTS – International English Language Testing System

TOEFL – Test of English as a Foreign Language

Pearson Test of English

Some specific health related courses may require students from a non-English speaking background to pass one of the above tests in order to gain professional registration. Each university has its own English proficiency requirements so check with each institution's policies as to what qualifications they will accept.

Tertiary study enrolment essentials: Tax File Number and Unique Student Identifier

Year 12 students planning to go to university should apply early for a <u>Tax File Number (TFN)</u> and a <u>Unique Student Identifier (USI)</u>. To be eligible for HECS-HELP or FEE-HELP (Commonwealth assistance), students must provide a TFN and a USI on their Commonwealth Assistance Form once they become a student. All universities and TAFE Queensland require you to have a TFN and USI and you can read more about <u>HECS-HELP</u> or visit the government StudyAssist <u>website</u>.

Provisional entry into Medicine update

If you're in your final year of high school (Queensland Year 12 or equivalent), you can apply for the Provisional Entry pathway. The minimum entry requirements for this pathway are:

- Queensland Year 12 English or <u>equivalent</u>
- an adjusted ATAR 95.00 or equivalent or higher
- a competitive <u>University Clinical Aptitude Test for Australia and New Zealand (UCAT ANZ)</u> aggregate score from the year you apply
- a multiple mini interview (MMI).

You'll need to sit the UCAT ANZ before you apply. The minimum required UCAT ANZ aggregate score depends on the performance of applicants and available places in the MD program. This score varies each year and can't be determined in advance. UCAT has a significant impact on whether you gain a place in the provisional entry program so you need to study, practice and ask for assistance when necessary.

After you apply, if you're eligible for the next stage, you'll be invited to an MMI. Meeting the minimum entry requirements does not guarantee admission.
