Team work makes the dream work

In spring (northern hemisphere) when you see the geese heading north for the summer, flying in a V formation, you might be interested in knowing what scientists have found out about why they fly that way. As each bird flaps its wings, it causes an uplift for the bird flying immediately behind. By flying in a V formation, the whole flock adds at least 71% greater flying range than if each bird flew on its own ... the birds get this!

Basic Truth No.1 People who share a common direction and sense of community can get where they are going quicker and easier because they are travelling on each others thrust.

Basic Truth No.2 If we have as much sense as a goose, we will stay in formation with those who are heading the way we are going.

When the lead goose gets tired, it rotates to the back and another goose flies point.

Basic Truth No.3 It pays to take turns doing hard jobs ... whether they are people or geese

The geese honk from behind to encourage those up front to keep up their speed.

Basic Truth No. 4 We need to be careful what we say when we honk from behind!

Finally, when a goose gets sick, or is wounded by gunshot and falls out, two geese fall out of the formation and follow it down to help protect it. They stay with it until it is either able to fly or until it is dead and then they launch out on their own or with another formation to catch up with their group.

Final Truth: If we have the sense of geese, we will stand by each other, work with each, support each other, be kind to each other and care about each other.

Unique Student Identifier (USI) - most people need one!

If you're planning to study at TAFE or University in 2027 or later, you'll need a Unique Student Identifier (USI). Without one, you won't be able to access government study support (ie: HECS-HELP, FEE-HELP), enrol in some courses or receive your qualification. You only get one USI and you may already have one if you completed a VET course at school. [Check if you have a USI](#) or [create one online](#) today — don't leave it until the last minute!

English and Maths eligibility for ATAR

If you're planning to receive an ATAR, there are a few important requirements to know. You must successfully complete an approved English subject with a Grade of C or higher. English is the only compulsory subject for ATAR eligibility. Universities may not accept Applied English as a prerequisite and may have additional subject prerequisites for specific courses. Your English result will only count towards your ATAR if it is one of your best five subject results. It's also important to note that only one English subject type (General or Applied) and one Mathematics subject type (General or Applied) can be included in your ATAR calculation. How IB Diploma students are considered for entry to tertiary courses

The International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Programme is a two-year senior secondary qualification recognised by Universities around the world. QTAC accepts the IB Diploma as equivalent to Year 12 QCE and converts IB results into an ATAR-like rank called the National ATAR. This allows IB students to apply for university courses across Australia and have their results fairly compared with students who completed state-based qualifications and received an ATAR. QTAC WARNING!

DO NOT apply to QTAC for 2027 entry into tertiary courses yet! QTAC is currently taking Semester 2, 2026 applications **NOT** 2027. If you apply before the 2027 opening date on 4 August, your application will not be considered!

What are minimum selection thresholds for competitive entry into courses?

A minimum selection threshold is the lowest adjusted ATAR or selection rank that received an offer for a course in a particular offer round. These thresholds can change each year depending on the number of applicants and the demand for the course. When working out your course preferences, it's important to check the latest minimum selection thresholds to get a realistic idea of the scores needed for entry.

Heads up! QTAC will have the Year 12 Undergraduate 2027 Guide on their website from this Friday, 5 June.
Note: QTAC applications don't open till 4 August, but good research leads to great decisions.



myQCE

The Queensland Curriculum and Assessment Authority (QCAA) Student Portal is where Year 12 students can access their final subject results, Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE), Queensland Certificate of Individual Achievement (QCIA) and other important information. Ideas to assist you with managing panic and reducing anxiety

Managing Stress and Panic

- Breathe: Stress can cause strong physical reactions, but they will pass. Focus on slowing your breathing.

- Take deep breaths: Breathe in and out slowly three times, closing your eyes if you can. Repeat until you feel calmer.
- Use positive self-talk: Remind yourself, "*I can cope,*" "*I can manage this,*" and "*It's OK.*"
- Distract yourself: Count backwards from 100, think about a favourite memory or focus on something around you.
- Remember it will pass: Stress and panic don't last forever.

Everyone feels stressed sometimes. Learning ways to manage it can help you feel more confident and in control. If stress or panic is becoming difficult to manage, talk to your school guidance officer, school counsellor or family doctor for support.

Important Responsibilities Every Student Needs to Own

Taking responsibility for your choices can help you build confidence and achieve your goals. Here are six tips from leadership expert Tim Elmore:

1. Own your attitude – You can't control everything that happens, but you can control how you respond.
2. Speak up at school – Ask questions, seek help when needed and take an active role in your learning.
3. Give your best effort – Focus on what matters most and commit fully to your goals.
4. Be on time – Punctuality shows respect for others and helps you stay organised.
5. Choose supportive people – Surround yourself with friends, teachers and mentors who encourage you to succeed.
6. Manage your screen time – Take control of how much time you spend online and make time for other important parts of life.

Some high school experiences can stick with us long after we've graduated.
