- Quality assure curriculum programs and moderation practices to ensure quality Teaching and Learning across the school.
- Support students at risk of disengagement
- Provide specialist coaches to support teacher expertise and continued success for all students.
- Ensure every student will be able to articulate what they need to do next in their learning
- Ensure all Year 12 students attain a QCE or QCIA or on an employment pathway
- All students achieving a C or better in English, Maths and Science.

Our initiatives include

- Developing a whole school approach to writing using the program Writer's Toolbox
- Engage and retain students at risk of disengagement through the provision of a Senior Success Coach, specialised learning programs and specialist teachers
- Responding to all students as individuals through differentiated practices and making necessary adjustments.
- Identify high yield teaching strategies (literacy and numeracy and embed these across all subject areas through the provisioning of pedagogical coaches
- Ensuring that staff have a deep and shared understanding of the Australian Curriculum and Senior Syllabi as outlined in the P-12 Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Plan.
- Aligning curriculum, pedagogy, assessment and reporting 7-10
- Improving student learning by continuing to build teacher capacity to differentiate for student needs in their classroom.
- Seek and fund opportunities for professional development and teacher release to support the school's Explicit Improvement Agenda – this includes supporting internal "Greendays" (teacher team planning days).
